

## END-OF-THE-YEAR BINGO REVIEW GAME

Learning Objective(s): The students will

1. Demonstrate their understanding of social studies knowledge and skills taught during the school year.
2. Enhance their critical thinking skills by obtaining information about social studies topics using pictures, symbols, and print material.

TEKS: SS K.1A, 2A, 9A, 10A&B, 1.1A, 2A, 12B, 13B&C, 2.1A, 4A&B, 6A, 12B, 13B, 14B

Materials: A blank Bingo Card and copies of selected Bingo Answer Tiles for each student in the class, scissors, glue, Bingo markers such as construction paper squares, beans, etc., prizes for Bingo winners (optional)

Teaching Strategy:

1. Note to the teacher:
  - (1) Before presenting the lesson, the teacher should decide which Bingo Card is appropriate for the grade level taught. Three different cards are attached to the lesson including one with 9 squares (Attachment 1), 16 squares (Attachment 2), or 25 squares (Attachment 3).
  - (2) The teacher should then decide which Answer Tiles students will use on their Bingo Cards (Attachments 4 & 5). The Answer Tiles are arranged according to grade level, with content taught in kindergarten listed first followed by first grade content and then second grade content.
  - (3) The teacher should choose the questions that match the selected Answer Tiles and cut them into strips.
2. Give each student in the class a blank Bingo Card and copies of the teacher-selected Bingo Answer Tiles. Instruct students to cut out the Answer Tiles and glue them on any of the squares on their Bingo Card.
3. After students have covered every square on their Bingo Cards, the teacher should give instructions about how the Bingo game will be played. Explain that a question will be drawn by the teacher, and the students will cover the answer to the question on their Bingo Card. Students should yell "Bingo" when they have covered a row

of squares on their cards horizontally, vertically, or diagonally.  
(Using the same cards, additional games of Bingo may be played  
such as Postage Stamp, Four Corners, and Black-Out Bingo.)
